## The Essentials for Recording Oral Histories

There are **TWO Workshops** in this training program. Each Workshop is taken over 2 days.

The training can be held in your community or at the National Library in Wellington or Auckland.

### Introduction to Oral History

#### Day one

A powerpoint presentation will touch on:

- Maori Research Methodology
- Equipment
- Agreement Form
- Interviewee Profile Form
- Ownership & copyright issues
- Asking the right questions
- Preservation & care
- Archiving recordings

#### Video Camera & Tools

- Tripod & accessories
- The Video Camera & basic functions
- Microphone / earphones
- Memory cards—which type?
- Setting up.

### Day two Effective filming

Practical exercises are in teams of three interchanging roles as video camera operator, interviewee and interviewer. Each exercise is group reviewed. Also covered will be:

- The interview environment
- Framing—interview shots
- The interview questionnaire. Probing questions.
- Filming photographs and objects

### Abstracting workshops

Hone your listening and comprehension skills to compile a reliable and usable abstract. The abstract is a concise time-coded summary which serves as a guide to the recorded information.

Abstracting interviews in te reo Maori will be addressed.

- You will learn to summarise and time code Information.
- The time code enables direct access to specific information.
